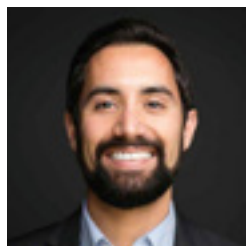
## JWJI 2020 Election Forum: What Happened and Why?

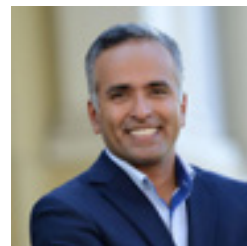
