PATHWAYS TO NURSING AT EMORY

BSN: 4-YEAR TIMELINE

Rising sophomores

Complete 60-credit hours at previous institution and ECAS with prerequisites and GERs

Junior and senior year at the School of Nursing

BSN: 5-YEAR TIMELINE

Rising juniors

Complete 60-credit hours at previous institution and ECAS with prerequisites and GERs

Senior and 5th year at the School of Nursing

MN: GRADUATE OPTION

Complete bachelor's at ECAS with nursing prerequisites

Move to Master of Nursing 15-month program

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN)

DEGREE: Bachelor of Science in Nursing

LENGTH: 4 semesters/2 years at the School of Nursing

START TIME: Fall semester (traditionally during junior year)

OUTCOME: Eligible to sit for the NCLEX and begin your career as a licensed registered nurse (RN)



BSN: APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS & GUARANTEED ADMISSION

- Complete application for admission Opens every June
- Submit resume/CV
- Upload unofficial transcript of Emory College classes
- Submit transcripts from additional institutions where you took undergraduate coursework
 - Submit optional personal statement
 - Waived: Application fee and test scores

Guaranteed Admission Criteria: As an Emory University student, you will be admitted to the BSN program if you maintain a 3.0 GPA AND complete all prerequisites with a C or higher, GERS, and 60 credit hours.

Prerequisites: Microbiology with lab (NRSG 205), Clinical Nutrition (NRSG 207)

- Undergraduate students must satisfy first- and second-year General Education Requirements (GERs) before entering the School of Nursing.
- GERs and additional credits are reviewed manually by the School of Nursing Registrar. All coursework must be completed with a letter grade for credit.
- Prerequisites do not need to be completed by the time of application. If admitted, students must complete all prerequisites with a C or higher by the time the program begins.

MASTER OF NURSING (MN)

DEGREE: Master of Nursing (MN)

LENGTH: 4 semesters/15 months

START TIME: Fall semester of each year (August)

OUTCOME: Eligible to sit for the NCLEX and begin your career as a licensed registered nurse (RN)

- Maintain 3.0 cumulative GPA for BSN; 3.5 competitive GPA for MN
- Complete 60-credit hours with grades prior to joining the School of Nursing for BSN
 - Connect with School of Nursing admission staff, attend relevant events and webinars, and get involved with the Pre-Nursing Club
