## **Connecting to your Remote Courses with Zoom**

Zoom is the web-conferencing tool that you will use to connect with your instructor and peers if your course holds live online sessions. It's easy-to-use. There is both a personal computer software option and a mobile device application. If at all possible, you should plan to access the live sessions for your course through a personal computer rather than your phone. If your class meets via Zoom, your instructor will use the same Zoom link throughout the course, and it will be shared with you via email or the course Canvas site. All you will need to do is click on the link to be connected. There will also be telephone dial-in instructions in case of internet connectivity difficulties.

Below are links and helpful tutorials to get you started. It is highly recommended that you try Zoom out before your first live class meeting.

If you have them, you should plan to use earbuds or a microphone headset and a webcam to participate in your live sessions. You should be prepared to appear on webcam (please dress appropriately!) and should always mute your microphone within Zoom if you are not currently speaking.
